New SOL

There have been some changes to the Skilled Occupation List (SOL) which take effect as of the 5 December, 2010.

Good news is that there have been 16 occupations added to the Schedule 4 and only one occupation removed. Schedule 4 lists occupations that Australian state or territories can add to their State Migration Plans (SMP).

New ENSOL

To apply under the ENS an overseas skilled worker must have been nominated by an Australian employer to fill a position in an occupation that appears on the ENSOL.

Much like changes to the SOL, there have also been changes to the ENSOL which also take effect as of the 5 December 2010. There have been 17 occupations added and only one occupation removed. This is fantastic news for those looking for Employer Sponsored Visas.

Update On State Migration Plans

Northern Territory (NT)

The Northern Territory State Migration Plan includes 52 skills that are not on the new SOL, including a range of trade skills.

The NT has one of the lowest unemployment rates in Australia. This is directly reflected in the NT's extensive list of occupations that are in demand which include engineers, construction trades, accountants and auditors, IT professionals, HR professionals, cooks, hotel managers, registered nurses, allied health professionals, welfare and social workers, automotive trades and hairdressers.

Queensland (QLD)

The QLD State Migration Plan includes 83 different occupations that are in demand. Predominantly in industries such as regional health practitioners and engineers for mining and coal seam gas projects.

Western Australia (WA)

The WA plan is known as the Western Australia Skilled Migration Occupation List (WASMOL).

The WASMOL contains many occupations; however there are strict guidelines and criteria. The strict guidelines and criteria include English language and work experience requirements, criteria for managers and professionals, criteria for technicians and trade workers, special conditions for Working Holiday (Subclass 417) visa holders, special conditions for applicants for Skilled-Sponsored (Subclass 886) visas as well as specific criteria for off-list nominations.

Tasmania (TAS)

The Tasmanian State Migration Plan (SMP) apparently quietly came into existence on 3 December 2010 and was officially announced by the on the 13 December 2010. Tasmania's SMP complements the Tasmanian Government's initiative to help alleviate skill shortages which exist in some industries, particularly medical and allied health, engineering and a range of trades.
